- 1 Floods are caused in areas where there is excessive downpour and poor drainage system - including overflow of water from rivers and oceans, water in the plains due to dam break and after heavy downpours. They can cause major destruction just as other natural calamities to some affected countries; Thailand, Pakistan and Australia.
- 2 The impact of the floods depends on their type and severity. Slow On-set Floods is caused when the water bodies such as rivers overflow and affect the nearby areas. This flood develops slowly and may last from a few days to weeks. These spread over several kilometres and mostly impact the low lying areas. Water accumulated due to flood in such areas may cause harm to property and can also be the cause of various diseases. Meanwhile, Rapid On-set Floods take slightly longer time to build and can last for a day or two but are extremely destructive. However, people are mostly warned about these and have the chance to escape before the situation becomes worse.
- 3 Flood like situation arises each time the downpour is more than the drainage system can absorb. At times, heavy rainfall occurring for a short period of time can cause flood while on other occasions light rainfall that goes on for days may result in flood like situation. The dams are created to hold water back as they are unable to detain large amount of water thereby resulting in flood in the nearby areas. At times, excessive water is **deliberately** released from the dam so as to stop it from breaking. This may also result in flood. Floods caused due to water logging after a heavy rainfall are known to have fatal consequences. It results in loss of life, rise in diseases, price rise, economic loss and destruction of the environment among other issues.
- 4 Many people and animals lose their lives because of severe flash floods. Many others get injured and are infected by various diseases. Water accumulated at places for days result in the breeding of mosquitoes and other insects that are the cause of various diseases such as malaria and dengue. Cases of dysentery, pneumonic plague and military fever are also on rise during this time. Soil Erosion occurs when the downpour is too heavy and the soil cannot absorb the entire water which in turn has dreadful consequences. In addition to the erosion of soil,

the quality of soil is also impacted and often degraded. Floods are not just a threat to the human beings and animals but also destroy the flora. Heavy rains are often accompanied by thunder, lightning and strong winds. These storms are a cause of uprooting of trees. Besides, the crops are damaged and several other plants are eroded during floods.

- 5 A better Flood Warning Systems are needed to be set up so that people are warned about the upcoming problem right on time and they have enough time to safeguard themselves and their belongings. Furthermore, buildings in the flood prone area must be constructed above the flood level so as to avoid damage to the property as well as the people living there. The government should also invest in building water storage systems to store and reuse the rain water. This way the excessive water can be put to use instead of letting it overflow on the plains and cause flood. Building good drainage systems is also essential to avoid water logging that results in flood.

- 6 Though we cannot do much about the rain or the melting of the glaciers, we can certainly build good drainage systems to deal with the water they bring along. Many countries, such as Singapore that receive heavy rainfall for most part of the year, have really good drainage system. They come out clean even after days of heavy downpour. Clearly it is a way to avoid the floods and reduce the damage they cause to the affected areas.

Train to Dabong

Travelling by train is an adventurous way to explore a destination. Some might even consider long train journeys to be romantic or idyllic. This is because on many scenic train journeys, passengers are often taken through the countryside, hills and valleys.

27 Unhurried travel has been gaining traction as a “post-pandemic” tourism trend after certain travel restrictions lifted. It does not just refer to the speed at which a trip is taken, but also by how meaningful or purposeful the journey is.

Experts have pointed out that travelling by train endorses the concept of slow travel. 28 Instead of rushing to get from one destination to the next.

In Malaysia, rail tourism goes hand-in-hand with rural tourism. 29 Local travellers began to take note of the train as a means of travel that connects between the cities. Previously it was not the main choice for travel.

30 The railway tourism product dubbed “Train to Dabong” from Wakaf Bharu, Tumpat to Dabong in Kuala Krai, is over 140km and takes almost three hours. Before, it was not a regular option for local residents to spend their holidays and free time.

Amid the pandemic, an unlikely town in Kelantan became a viral sensation. That town is Dabong and it was really the train journey dubbed “Train to Dabong” that was celebrated by locals when interstate travel was still restricted. 31

Now that travel bans have been lifted, Dabong continues to attract visitors due to a plethora of activities and attractions available there. Every day we can see many visitors uploading their pictures and experiences to social media platforms.

An absolute highlight is a special light phenomenon called the "God Light" that takes place inside Gua Keris. 32 . Among the activities are hiking, camping and exploring the flora and fauna. It is home to several majestic peaks (Gunung Ayam, Gunung Stong and Gunung Che Tahir just to name a few) as well as the multi-tiered Jelawang Waterfall.

Places of Interest in Malaysia

A - PETRONAS TWIN TOWERS, KUALA LUMPUR

Standing at 451.9m, the world-renowned Petronas Twin Towers is currently the world's tallest twin structure and fifth tallest building. The skybridge that links the two towers symbolizes a gateway to the future.

B - PORTA DE SANTIAGO, MELAKA

It is one of Melaka's most famous landmarks. It is one of the four main entrances to the A'Famosa fortress, which was built in 1511 by Alfonso d'Albuquerque, a Portuguese admiral. Even though the rest of the fortress was badly damaged during the Dutch invasion in 1641, its iconic gateway still stands to this day.

C - GUNUNG LEDANG NATIONAL PARK, JOHOR

Gunung Ledang is known as much for its captivating natural beauty as the legend surrounding it. The trail up the mountain is a spectacular experience as cascading waterfalls, flowing streams and variety of flora and fauna species greet the eye. On a clear day, stunning views of the Straits of Malacca and its surroundings can be seen from the top.

D - ZOO TAIPING & NIGHT SAFARI, PERAK

Home to some 180 local and exotic wildlife species, Zoo Taiping is the country's first zoo. Join the Night Safari for a ride on the mini train around the zoo and catch some of the zoo's nocturnal inhabitants in action.

E - PENANG HILL

One of Penang's main icons, Penang Hill is a popular retreat for those who escape the city's blistering heat. Also known as Bukit Bendera or Flagstaff Hill, Penang Hill soars 833m above sea level. A brand-new funicular train service takes visitors to the summit in less than half an hour, where a spectacular panoramic view of Georgetown and its surrounding awaits at the viewing deck.

F - GELANGGANG SENI, KELANTAN

Known as the centre of Kelantan's folk art, Gelanggang Seni is a place where you can try your hand at traditional games or musical instruments, or catch traditional cultural performances unique to the state such as Wayang Kulit (shadow puppetry) and Mak Yong (traditional musical drama).
